## Dr John Cole—Office of Clean Energy



As founding head of the Office of Clean Energy, Dr Cole is responsible for developing and delivering on the Queensland Government's commitment to renewable energy, demand management innovation, and energy efficiency. John served as an executive director of the Queensland Environmental Protection Agency heading its non-regulatory innovation divisions for nearly 10 years until October 2008. He has been involved in public policy, industry development, environment management and community empowerment. He is also an Adjunct Professor in industry, organisational and community sustainability at three leading Queensland universities.

## Errol McKenzie—Deloitte



Errol leads the Energy and Resources industry team for the Risk Services Team within Deloitte. Errol's primary focus has been internal audit, risk management, IT Audit process & systems integrity and fatigue management.
